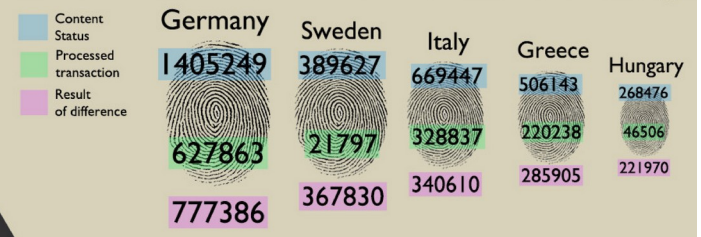
EU RESPONSE

 1.3 Asylum seekers in 2015

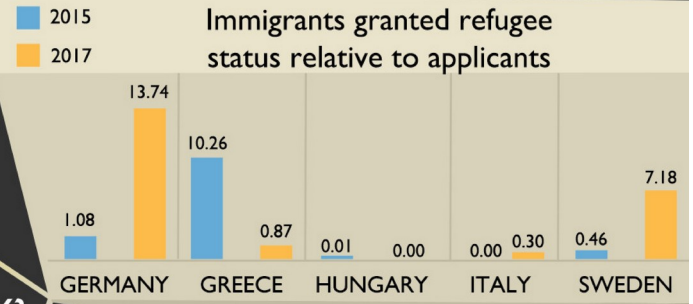
Common European Asylum System → goal: harmonize EU response to asylum flows

Failed: Resulted in a deharmonized response from member states

Eurodac: Info Sharing

Conclusion: Differences between member states + state-centric nature of migration policy = de-harmonized EU response to migration crisis
